Dear Sir:

On receipt of your letter, I obtained your file to see what was the matter. While a default was taken on January 29, 1975, by one of the Commissioners on a calendar call, I am going to reopen the default taking into consideration your letter that you did not default at that time and your circumstances.

You do not need to send in another petition. I am going to be in Rochester on May 20th to hear cases that week. I have rescheduled your case for Tuesday, May 20, 1975, at 2:30 in the afternoon to be held at 1 Marine Midland Plaza, Rochester, New York, and I want to hear your side of it at that time. This is a special time specifically reserved for your case so make every effort to be there because I do not travel to Rochester that often for hearings.

I have asked the Income Tax Bureau to bring their papers for their side of this for that time. Be sure to bring whatever papers and checks you think would help. Under separate cover I am sending you and the Income Tax Bureau a special notice of hearing so everyone will be there at the same time.
